- Shared projects that feature the various ways we learn about global causes like World Water Day & Earth Day








Building Relationships: Padlet

Between January - March, students in each of our classes were able to interact on a <u>Padlet</u>. Here are some of the observations we made on the padlet:

- The student were highly engaged and eager to share and comment on the padlet.
- Many students noticed they shared more similarities than differences.
- The age differences in the students did not keep the students from interacting.
- It was not difficult to maintain this tool in our classrooms.







Building Relationships: School Tours

Between January - May, students created video or photo tours of their schools asynchronously. They shared out their reactions to those tours through padlet or email.

Here are some observations we made as a result of our school tour exchanges:


- As students viewed the tours, they noticed many similarities about the inside of their schools, but noticed many differences about the areas around their schools.
- The students were very inquisitive about the start and end of the school day.

In May, we attempted to host a multi-class video call!


















Building Relationships: Video Calls

Here are some observations we made during our video call:

- The students were very quiet and nervous at first.
- It was helpful to review the school tours before having the students ask each other questions.
- It was not overwhelming to have 3 classes participate, but having more classes might not have been manageable.
- The students were eager to share their favorite colors, subjects and ask questions about what school is like
- The student engagement might have been higher if they had another opportunity to have another video call





Our Conclusions!

Here are some new ideas we had as a result of this Collaboration:

- We may have set too many goals for this collaboration initially, but we were able to adjust throughout the process.
- Communication was difficult at times, but we learned it was important to give each other grace.
- Over time the teachers began to develop a relationship with each other.
 Our relationships between our classrooms may have been stronger if we had began with developing our own relationships.
- Extending this project into set partnerships instead of one large group would help with continuing to develop relationships amongst our classes.
- The students walked away seeing more similarities between their schools than differences.
- It was important to let each school use the online tools that were most easily accessible to them.
